In order to help create a positive camp atmosphere for everyone, campers and their parents must sign that they have read the Camper Code of Conduct. Campers are expected to behave appropriately and promote a **safe, fun and healthy** environment through productive participation. Please go through the Code of Conduct with your child so that he/she fully understands these expectations.

Camper Code of Conduct

As a camper, I will:

- Be polite to other campers. I understand that horseplay, unwelcome teasing or other unkind behaviors such as pushing, kicking, hitting or fighting are not allowed at camp.
- Show respect to staff, and cooperate fully with their instructions.
- Communicate in an appropriate manner, which means I must not use foul language or gestures, harsh words or tone of voice.
- Treat nature with kindness. I will stay on trails and show respect to animals and plants.
- Use program equipment, supplies, and facilities properly.
- Respect the property of others.
- Be fully responsible for my actions and understand that irresponsible behavior could result in disciplinary action.

The staff will use a positive approach to discipline should a behavior issue arise and will seek parental support to resolve these issues and to encourage positive behavior. Participants who remain disruptive after consultation with the parents may be dismissed from the program.
